#### Foundation Students Begin Their Maths Journey!

Our Foundation students have been eagerly engaging with early maths concepts in the classroom! Over the past week, they have been learning to count small groups of objects, focusing on groups of 1, 2, and 3.

Through hands-on activities and interactive games, they are developing their ability to:

- 🔢 Count groups of 1 and 2 objects
- Recognize that the last number counted tells us how many objects are in the group
- Read and write the numbers 1 and 2, and recognize their number names

Building on this foundation, they have also explored counting groups of 1, 2, and 3 objects arranged in a line, further strengthening their number recognition and counting skills.

It has been wonderful to see their excitement as they begin to make connections between numbers, counting, and the world around them. We encourage families to support this learning at home by practicing counting everyday objects like toys, buttons, or fruit.

We look forward to seeing our young learners continue to grow in confidence with their maths skills!



## EVERY DAY COUNTS!

Every Day Counts — is your child at school today?

Being at school every day counts. If your child is absent one day per week, this quickly adds up to two months of missed school in a year.

- 1. All children should be enrolled at school and attend on every school day.
- 2. Schools should monitor, communicate and implement strategies to improve regular school attendance.
  - 3. Truanting can place a student in unsafe situations and impact on their future employability and life choices.



#### Affordable Psychological Support for Adults and Children

FedCare Psychology Services provides psychological services to members of community within Ballarat and surrounding districts. Our first consultation is free, ongoing sessions are \$10 per session or \$5 for concession card holders. You do not need a GP referral to access our services.

Psychological services will be provided by provisionally registered psychologists, who are currently undertaking advanced training in the <u>Master of Psychology (Clinical)</u> and the <u>Master of Professional Psychology</u> programs. All services provided are closely supervised by a team of highly-experienced registered psychologists, all of whom hold both endorsement in clinical psychology and registration as clinical supervisors with the Psychology Board of Australia in APHRA.

We offer a range of psychological services for children (5 years and older), adolescents, adults, including psychological and educational assessment, and the psychological treatment of various behavioural and emotional problems, such as:

- · Depression
- · Anxiety and phobias
- · Anger management
  - · Trauma and grief
- · Eating-body image problems
  - · Sleep disturbances
    - Bullying
    - · Stress
    - Grief and loss
  - · Relationship difficulties
    - Sexual issues
    - · Parent-child conflict
- Bed-wetting and toileting problems
  - · Adjustment problems

We currently have appointments available for adults and adolescents and short waitlist for children. Our waitlist for cognitive and educational assessments is open for the second half of 2025.

#### **Volunteer with Anakie Fire Brigades**

CFA is a volunteer-based organisation that works to protect the lives and properties of millions of Victorians. We have 54,000 members working in over 1,200 brigades across Victoria, ranging from small rural towns to outer metropolitan suburbs. Callouts at brigades can vary between one and 1,000 each year.

Our volunteers undertake a range of tasks such as fighting fires, road rescues, emergency medical response, fundraising, marketing and community education and engagement. We work together to connect with and help others in the communities in which we live and work.

#### **Firefighters (Operational Volunteers)**

Firefighters (operational volunteers) respond to fire, road accidents and other incidents where risks are posed to life and/or property. Operational roles may also involve management of vegetation, fire equipment or assisting other emergency agencies.

#### **Non-Operational Volunteers (Support)**

Non-Operational (Support) roles do not fight fires directly yet provide vital support to brigades.

Non-operational roles may vary between brigades but commonly include:

- Relationships, engagement and education across local communities
- Coordination of fundraising, campaigns, events and activities
- Media, promotion and publicity
- Administration, logistical and financial support
- Brigade training and equipment maintenance
- Brigade health and safety management
- Community education and preparedness
- Coordination of brigade meetings and representation of brigade in group meetings Junior leaders

Non-operational volunteers also attend brigade meetings and other brigade events.
